

SEATBELT EXEMPTION STATEMENT:Company Cover Sheet



Sections 267, 267A, 267B and 267C of the Road Safety Rules 2017

Use this form to claim a seatbelt exemption for eligible infringement fines issued to a company.

What fines are eligible for a seatbelt exemption?

You can only claim a seatbelt exemption for a camera-detected fine issued for the offences:

- · Driver with incorrectly worn seatbelt.
- · Driver failing to ensure passenger wearing seatbelt.

A seatbelt exemption can only be claimed for a fine issued to a company that is at **Notice of Final Demand or Warrant stage**.

Nominating seatbelt offences

If the fine is at Infringement or Penalty Reminder stage the company is not eligible to claim a seatbelt exemption. The company must nominate the person who was driving the vehicle at the time of the offence. You should nominate the driver as quickly as possible, because once the fine reaches Notice of Final Demand stage it is too late to nominate. For a seatbelt offence, you can only nominate another driver. You cannot nominate a passenger for failing to wear a seatbelt. Once the fine has been reissued to the nominated driver, they may be eligible to claim a seatbelt exemption.

What exemptions are valid?

If the fine is at **Notice of Final Demand or Warrant stage**, you can claim a seatbelt exemption for a camera-detected fine if:

- Door-to-door service exemption: if the driver was required to get in or out of the vehicle frequently, the vehicle was not travelling over 25km/h, and the driver was:
 - engaged professionally in delivering or collecting goods door-to-door, or
 - o engaged professionally in collecting waste.
- No seatbelt fitted exemption: if the driver or passenger were sitting in a position in the vehicle that was not fitted with a seatbelt, and there is no requirement for that position to be fitted with a seatbelt.

What evidence is required?

You will need to provide evidence to support your seatbelt exemption statement. The type of evidence required will depend on the exemption you are claiming.

You should attach any supporting evidence to the application. If supporting evidence is not provided, your application may not be successful.

Supporting evidence could include:

- A certificate from the Department of Transport and Planning confirming there is no requirement for the driver or passenger seat to be fitted with a seatbelt
- Evidence showing the driver or passenger was engaged in eligible professional duties at the time of the offence, such as a copy of a delivery run sheet
- Documentation from a medical specialist confirming that the driver or passenger had a medical exemption from wearing a seatbelt at the time of the offence.

How do I claim an exemption?

What happens after you submit your claim?

Your request will be processed by Fines Victoria as an Enforcement Review under the ground of Contrary to Law. You will be notified of the outcome via post.

Are there other options for dealing with this fine?

If you are not eligible to claim a seatbelt exemption, the options available for dealing with your fine will depend on what stage the fine is at.
